This wine was first made during a time when Rosé was an anathema in a region becoming world- renowned for big, bold Shiraz. Turkey Flat created a style crafted with clear purpose to shift perceptions, demonstrating that Australian Rosé can be a fine wine and that the Barossa is well-placed to be its source.

TASTING NOTES

Classic Turkey Flat Rosé makers burst out the glass that include fresh red summer berries along with watermelon, grapefruit, and guava with a dash of spice and perfumed Turkish Delight. The palate is tight and taught and beautifully structured with mouthwatering acidity, puckering phenolics and a delicate sweetness. A perfectly consistent and balanced wine full of sophistication, always inviting you back for more.

VINTAGE 2026

The season started off with a bang in mid-February, where a weeklong heat wave in late January accelerated ripening. But what looked to be a fast and frenetic vintage was suddenly halted by early march rainfall. The welcomed rain helped vines recover and reset from the hot, drying conditions. Berry splitting became a real concern across the region, but thankfully all Turkey Flat fruit was unscathed and continued hanging disease free. From here, vintage ran at a much slower and steadier pace, with the last fruit harvested in mid-April. A long vintage full of challenges, but one which will be remembered for high quality wines.

WINEMAKING

Each individual vineyard was picked and vinified separately at differing stages of maturity. Upon picking, the fruit was crushed and delicately pressed to stainless steel tanks to cold settle, before being racked and fermented. Fermentation was cool and long to maximise aromatic intensity and purity. Post ferment, the wine was blended, filtered, and sent straight to bottle to preserve freshness.
